Birds are animals. An animal is only creature which can move on its own free will. The other types of animals are fishes, reptiles, mammals and insects. However, birds are different from the other animals because they have feathers, have two legs and two wings, and with some exceptions, poses the wonderful ability to fly.

Like every other living things, birds have developed over a long period of time to suit their environment and their needs through an extremely gradual process of evolution. At some point in the history of the world, hundreds of millions of years ago, cold blooded reptiles changed gradually into warm blooded flying animals. Scientists have certain clues to the mystery of this change.

One such clue is to skeleton of the prehistoric creature which was part reptile and part bird, known as the archaeopteryx. This animal lived was partly feathered and had wings which is used to fly and glide.

The various types and colours of feathers which different birds wear have specific purposes. For example, the bodies warm during the fold season. In this way the bird is able to fly freely even when it is cold. In addition, the feathers protect the bird from getting wet during the rainy season feathers also play an important part during mating. On such occasions, the male birds makes himself look as splendid as possible by ruffling or displaying his feathers to impress a female bird. One example at such birds is the peacock. In order to attract a female bird, a peacock usually displays its beautiful feathers.
